

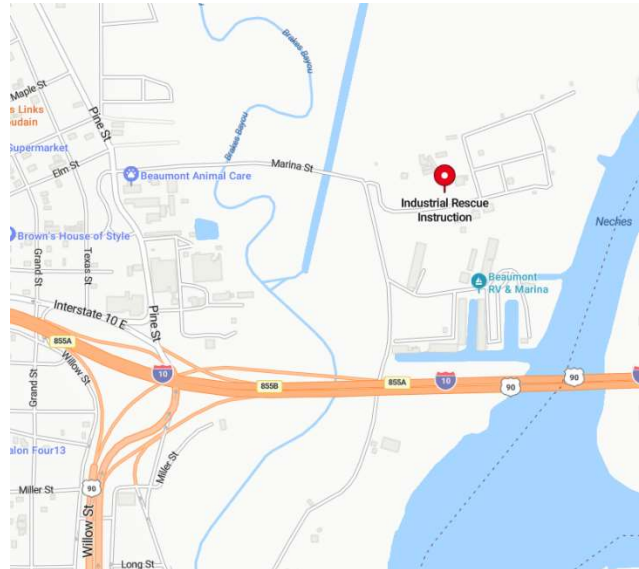
Beaumont Area Hazmat and CO₂ Pipeline Emergency Response Training hosted by ExxonMobil

PPE Requirements

- Full-length pants are required for all participants; shorts are strictly prohibited.
- Short sleeves are allowed, but sleeveless shirts are prohibited.
- Sturdy closed-toed boots/shoes are required. Open-toed shoes are prohibited.
- All students must provide (mandatory), firefighting gear for participation in classroom and outside activities.
- Students are highly encouraged to bring personal SCBA mask's (SCOTT brand) that are issued to the student for use and pass inspection.

Course Description

ExxonMobil is sponsoring this training in cooperation with Jefferson County ESD#3, TEEX, and Industrial Rescue Instruction Systems, Inc. This two-part course features an industry-first module on CO₂ releases and provides advanced, hands-on and companion classroom simulations focused on responding to multiple types of pipeline incidents. The training further prepares firefighters along pipelines and near facilities to respond to industrial-type emergencies. The training will include live-fire exercises on the IRFT training grounds, and a simulated CO₂ pipeline release utilizing the first-ever mobile CO₂ response training trailer. 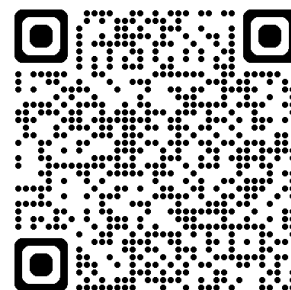
